About the Temple University Diamond Marching Band

The "Pride of the Cherry and White," the Temple University Diamond Marching Band presents exciting and innovative contemporary shows during the fall semester. The Marching Band performs a traditional pre-game show with varied half-time shows throughout the season. In addition to six hours of rehearsal per week, activities are arranged to be compatible with student schedules. The "Pride of The Cherry and White" Marching Band performs at all home games and also travels to select away games and to Bowl Games.

The Diamond Marching Band participated in the 2011 New Mexico Bowl, the 2009 EagleBank Bowl, the first Sugar Bowl in 1935 (Temple vs. Tulane), the Mirage Bowl held in Tokyo, Japan, the Garden State Bowl at the Giants Stadium, and the "We the People 200 Parade," celebrating the bicentennial of the United States Constitution. The Diamond Marching Band is regularly invited to perform at exhibitions. They have also appeared in New York City on The Today Show and Good Morning America.

The Diamond Band has taken part in Hollywood movies and events held in Philadelphia and New York. They recently performed at the premiere of Here Comes the Boom starring Kevin James, appeared in the Oscar nominated movie, The Wolf of Wall Street and can be seen in the remake of Annie starring Jamie Foxx and Cameron Diaz. The band has also appeared on TV in episodes of the CBS drama Madam Secretary, and most recently, The Tonight Show starring Jimmy Fallon.

The music played by the Diamond Band has garnered national attention. The band was named in Rolling Stone Magazine in the article "Top 10 Marching Band Cover Songs" for their rendition of Kanye West's All of the Lights and in USA Today for their version of 5 Seconds of Summer's hit, She Looks So Perfect. The band has also received social media shout-outs from artists they have covered such

as Camila Cabello, Paramore, Bastille, Fall Out Boy, AJR, and Walk the Moon. The Band's 2016 Show Panic! At the Disco has surpassed 2.5 million views on YouTube, and their video of BTS's *Idol* from last year has received 2.6 million.

The Diamond Marching Band's large and diverse membership provides exciting opportunities for instrumentalists, color guard performers and twirlers from every School and College at Temple University. The band's membership is comprised of 75% non-music majors.

About the Conductors

MATTHEW BRUNNER is Associate Professor of Instrumental Music and Director of Athletic Bands for the Boyer College of Music and Dance. His responsibilities at Temple include serving as Director of the Diamond Marching and Basketball Bands, conductor of the Symphonic Band and Collegiate Band and serving as instructor of courses in conducting. A native of Dover, Ohio, he received the Doctor of Music degree in wind conducting from Indiana University. He received his Bachelor of Music degree in music education, and his Master of Music degree in Instrumental Conducting from Ohio University in Athens, Ohio. He went on to become one of the band directors in the Carrollton School District in Carrollton, Ohio. His musical versatility was frequently showcased as he could be heard on trumpet in several area concert bands, orchestras, jazz, rock and funk bands.

Dr. Brunner is credited with over two hundred marching band arrangements for university and high school marching bands across the country. His Marching Band arrangements have received national recognition in USA Today and Rolling Stone Magazine, as well as the websites of Ryan Seacrest, Alternative Press Magazine, and popular artists such as Panic! At the Disco, Imagine Dragons, Sia, Paramore, Fall Out Boy, Sheppard and Bastille.

The Diamond Band has made several appearances on local and national television and in movies. Students from the band have appeared on *The Today Show*, *Good Morning America*, *Hardball with Chris Matthews*, and on the CBS series *Madam Secretary*. The band made big screen appearances in the 2014 remake of *Annie*, and in the Academy Award Nominated *The Wolf of Wall Street*. The band has performed in the EagleBank Bowl, New Mexico Bowl, Boca Raton Bowl, Military Bowl, and the Bad Boy Mowers Gasparilla Bowl. The Basketball Band has performed at Tournaments in Miami, Tucson, Jacksonville, Nashville, Memphis, New York, Orlando, Dayton, Norfolk, Hartford, Brooklyn, and Salt Lake City.

Dr. Brunner serves as an adjudicator, clinician, and guest conductor across the country. He has published articles in the *Teaching Music Through Performance in Band* and *Teaching Music Through Performance in Beginning Band* series as well as the National Band Association Journal. In 2007, he was one of the winners of the National Band Association's International Conducting Symposium, which took place in Sherborne, England. Dr. Brunner received the National Band Association's Citation of Excellence in 2015. His professional affiliations include The National Band Association, Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, Kappa Kappa Psi, the College Band Director's National Association, the National Association for Music Education (NAfME) and the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association. Dr. Brunner resides in the Philadelphia suburbs with his wife, Janice, and two sons, Kyler and Kaden.

SCHYLER ADKINS, a native of southern Delaware, attended the University of Delaware, earning his Bachelor's Degree in Music Education in 2016. After graduating, Schyler taught instrumental music at Brandywine High School in Wilmington, DE including concert bands, jazz band, marching band, steel pans, music theory, and music production. He also served on the DMEA board, planning the DE Solo and Ensemble festival for several years. Schyler now attends Temple University, and plans to earn a M.M. in Wind Conducting in Spring 2022.

CHRIS HETTENBACH grew up in Carroll County, Maryland attended Towson University where he earned his Bachelor's degree in Music Education. During his time at Towson University, he served as the Student Director of the Marching Band as well as the Vice President of Service for the national honorary service fraternity, Kappa Kappa Psi. After graduation, Chris immediately attended Temple University in pursuit of obtaining his Graduate degree in Wind Band Conducting and is currently in his first year of the program.

ZACH EISENGREIN (Drum Major) is a 5th year senior in the Music program from Bachelor of Science in Morrisville. Pennsylvania. He has served the Diamond Band for nearly five years in the trumpet section, as Trumpet Section Leader, and as Drum Major. His favorite band memory is playing the Ed Sheeran show at the 2017 Gasparilla Bowl in St Petersburg, Fl. Outside of band, he enjoys singing with the Temple University Concert Choir, practicing and eating peanut butter. Zach hopes to attend trumpet, Northwestern University in Fall 2022 to pursue a career in music education.

Temple University

Temple University's history begins in 1884, when a young working man asked Russell Conwell if he could tutor him at night. It wasn't long before he was teaching several dozen students—working people who could only attend class at night but had a strong desire to make something of themselves. Conwell recruited volunteer faculty to participate in the burgeoning night school, and in 1888 he received a charter of incorporation for "The Temple College." His founding vision for the school was to provide superior educational opportunities for academically talented and highly motivated students, regardless of their backgrounds or means. The fledgling college continued to grow, adding programs and students throughout the following decades. Today, Temple's more than 35,000 students continue to follow the university's official motto—Perseverantia Vincit, or "Perseverance Conquers"—with their supreme dedication to excellence in academics, research, athletics, the arts and more.
