When *The Beggar's Opera* was staged in 1728, there is no way that the author, John Gay, the composer, Johann Chrstian Pepusch, or the audience could have predicted that they were witnessing the birth of one of the most successful plays in the history of the English stage. Or that it would lead to an array of adaptations, including the two we're selecting from today, Bertolt Brecht and Kurt Weill's *The Threepenny Opera* (1928), and John Latouche and Duke Ellington's *Beggar's Holiday* (1946). This production brings together for the first time these three powerful blendings of satire and sentiment. As we move backward in time from adaptations to original, we hope you enjoy how these plays pose enduring questions about sexual attraction, love, and justice through a range of musical and verbal idioms.
