About the Artists

She began her studies at Temple University in 2017 with notable teachers including Professor Kun-Yang Lin and Dr. yonTande Whitney Hunter. Hannah has presented choreographic works through We Love Erie Days, Temple University Student Dance Concert, and D2D: Dare to Dance.

LINDSEY GARNHART is a junior BFA dance major and business minor at Temple University. Prior to coming to Temple, she studied dance for many years at Center for Dance Education (CDE) in Clark, NJ, as well as Broadway Dance Center in New York City and New Jersey Ballet in Livingston, NJ. Since moving to Philadelphia, she has been lucky enough to be a part of Klassic Contemporary Ballet Company under the direction of Kim Landle, as well as joining InMotion Dance Team, of which she is now the co-captain. She has choreographed for InMotion and CDE, her home studio. This performance is her first presentation of work within the Dance Department!

AMELIA MARTINEZ is a third year MFA in Dance student. She is a dancing artist (modern dance based) and choreographs with yarn in recurring themes of femininity, Latinidad, and community. She graduated from Old Dominion University in 2014 with a BA in Dance and a minor in Psychology. Notable performances are with the Elbert Watson Dance Company and as a Can-Can dancer in the Virginia Opera's production of *Orpheus in the Underworld*. Currently she is working on her thesis concert/dance film that is set to premiere in March.
