About the Artists

HANNAH BORCZON, originally from Erie, Pennsylvania, grew up dancing with Erie Dance Theater, CADANCE Dance Company, Mercyhurst University, and Sovereign Ballet. She choreographed the one-act ballet *Kore* which was presented at Mercyhurst University and produced Home of the Free Because of the Brave, a dance fundraiser for veterans. She began her studies at Temple University in 2017 where she has worked with Professor Kun Yang Lin, Jillian Harris, Dr. Laura Katz Rizzo, and Dr. yonTande Whitney Hunter. Hannah has presented choreographic works through We Love Erie Days, Student Dance Concerts, and D2D: Dare to Dance.

CHRISTINE COLOSIMO is a third year PhD student at Temple University. Her research focus is on American modern dance choreographer, Erick Hawkins, who she apprenticed with in the 1980s. She has an MA in Dance Education from Columbia University, Teachers College and a BFA in Dance from Rutgers University. Christine has been teaching in higher education for over ten years and has taught children's dance for over thirty years. She is the founder and director of a dance cooperative in NJ which promotes and encourages dancers over forty to continue their craft.

ABBY CRONIN & MACIE WERNTZ are both first year BFA Dance majors at Temple University. They are from Massachusetts and have similar dance backgrounds and interests in choreography. These dancers especially enjoyed working together after a long year of having little to no physical contact with other artists.
